

## Sitings 2014, February 21, 2014-June 1, 2014

Established in 1995, *Sitings* is an annual competition that invites RISD students to respond to the Museum's collection, its architectural idiosyncrasies, and the way people navigate its spaces. This year RISD alumnus and Providence-based artist Brian Chippendale juried the competition. The winning artists are Nafis White and Garcia Sinclair (both BFA 2015 Sculpture) for *Light Source Seeking Surface for Transparent Relationship* and Aaron Pexa (MFA 2014 Glass) for *Back Door @ the Pendleton*.

Two pink and orange neon signs at this clandestine entry of the Pendleton House call out an alternate experience for the viewer. The words PEEP SHOW and ROOMS tip the viewer off to the voyeuristic nature of Pendleton House's format, encouraging them to look upon the home's contents with perhaps a more lustful eye. Neon light washes the dimly lit period rooms with a quality reminiscent of a 1970s Times Square or other "entertainment" districts. An 18th-century buffet table seen under the neon glow creates conflicting visuals, relocating the meaning of the decorative art object and using humor to alter the atmosphere of the Museum.

This bridge serves as a space that is both interior and exterior: the walls are not opaque, and the space and the audience are both inside and outside the edifice. The bridge has its own tone, its own metronome. It serves as a place of quiet contemplation, juxtaposed with views looking out to the bustling activities below.
